being sick and weak in Body but of sound mind & Memory thanks
be given to God, Do make and Ordain this my last Will & Testament
in manner and form following (That is to say) First I recommend
my soul to Almighty God hoping to receive pardon and Remission
of all my sins through the merits of my Saviour Jesus Christ
and my Body to the Earth to be Interred in Christian Burial
at the discretion of my Executors herein after named and for
what Worldly Goods God in his Mercy hath been pleased to
bestow upon me I Bequeath and Dispose of the same in
the following Manner and Form

Imprimis

145th I Impose my Desire is that my Just Debts and Funeral Expences
be first Satisfied and Paid.

Item I Give unto my son James Humphrey and to his Heirs
forever the Plantation whereon he now Lives

Item I Give unto my son Benjamin Humphrey and to his Heirs
forever a parcel of Land containing one hundred Acres that I
bought lately of Jeremiah Corbin being part of a Tract of Land whereon
he lives and the said one hundred Acres of Land not being acknowledged
to me my Desire is that the said Land may be Acknowledged to my
said son Benjamin Humphrey

Item I Give unto my aforesaid son James Humphrey and Josep
Humphrey Two hundred Acres of Land laying in the great fork of
Rappahannock River being part of a Tract belonging to Alexander
McQueen bounded by a Tract belonging to Col^l Furr and Cap^t Yancey
and my Desire is that the said Two hundred Acres of Land
shall be equally Divided betwixt my abovesaid two sons James
and Josep Humphrey.

Item I Give unto my son Jonathan Humphrey and his Heirs for
ever the Plantation whereon I now Live,

Item I Give my Wife Liberty to take any one of the abovesaid Plantations to live upon whenever she pleases and which she pleases, During her life Time without any Violation of any one of my abovesaid Sons.

Item I Give unto my Daughter Mary Humphrey the Corner Cupboard that is fast up in my House.

Item I Give unto my Wife Margaret Humphrey all my Household Furniture and all the rest of my Estate during her life and at her decease to be equally Divided among my following Children (Viz: Benjamin, Jesse, Jonathan, Mary, Bathsheba, and Charity Humphrey, And in case my Wife should be with Child at the Time of my decease and the Child should be born alive the said Child to have an equal part of my Estate with aforesaid six Children.

Item I likewise Constitute my Wife whole Executrix during her life and my son James Humphrey and my Brother, Will^m Humphrey and M^r John Fitzchow Executors after her

Decease of this my last Will and Testament and I do utterly
 Disallow Revoke and Disannull all and every other former
 Wills Legacies and Bequests and Executors by me in any
 Way before named Willed and Bequeathed Ratifying and
 Confirmed this and no other to be my last Will and Testament
 In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal
 this 16th Day of November 1766.
