Item I give to my Daughter Rachel Pitcher fifteen pounds current
money to be lent out upon Interest untill she becomes of age or
marries and the rest of my Estate to be Equally Divided Between
my Children and they to have it as they come of age

And last of all I leave my Beloved wife Frances Pitcher and
Robert Smith Executors Witnesses hereunto I set my hand and
Seal this 25th day of September one Thousand seven hundred & Seventy
three
