Item I Give and Bequeath to my son John Wharton all and
Singular my Estate Real and Personal But if in Case he should
Die before he comes to the Age of Eighteen Years it is my Will
and Desire that his Brother Thomas Ammon and his two Sisters
Margaret and Anne Ammon have it Equally Divided amongst
them and also to their Heirs
It is my will and desire that my wife Puddlefield have the Use
of the same during her Life

It is my will and desire that ~~Thomas~~ ^{John} Subblefield have the Care
and Management of my son John Wharton till he arrives to the
Age of Twenty one Years

I also Appoint Thomas Subblefield and John Thackeray Executors
of this my Last Will and Testament utterly revoking all former
Wills by me at any Time made; I do hereby Acknowledge this
my Last Will and Testament as Witness my Hand and Seal
