calling unto mind to mortality of my body and knowing that it is appoint-
ed for all men once to die do make and Ordain this my last will and
Testament that is to say Principally and first of all I give and Recommend
soul into hands of God that gave it and for my Body I recommend it to the
earth to be buried in a christian like and decent manner at the Discretion
of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall
receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touching
such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me with
in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following
manner and form

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Imprimis I give to my son Thomas Pratt my horse and Mare colt and two

my wife and Lysing of my life and after my death the half of the
Increase of my young mare and the half of the Increase of my other Stock
and at my death I give my son Thomas Pratt all the principal of my stock
and all the Lysing

in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the following manner and form

Imprimis I give to my son Thomas Pratt my horse and Mare colt and two Stears for the use of the plantation to make bread for the support of me my wife and ~~enduring~~ of my life and after my death the half of the Increase of my young mare and the half of the Increase of my other Stock and at my death I give my son Thomas Pratt all the principal of my stock and all I possess.

Item I give to my wifes daughter Matharine Redman the Bed she now lies on and one ~~bed~~ ^{Culpeper County, Virginia Wills}

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Now leave and appoint my son Thomas Pratt Executor of this my last Will and Testament given under my hand this 25th day of October One Thousand seven hundred and Seventy seven
