four Negroes, Adam, Kitt, Dinah, Sarah, with all their Increase from the date
shall be equally Divided between my said Brother William Glasp and my
Nephew Belfield have, But and if either my said Brother William Glasp or my
Nephew Belfield have should Die before the Division or the time of the Division
be, then the whole four Negroes as above named and Increase shall be to him that
Surviveth, And his Heirs forever - and if my said Brother William Glasp, and Nephew
Belfield have should both Die before the Division or the time of Division should be,
then the whole four Negroes as above named and Increase shall be and I Give the
same to my well beloved Brother in Law Benjamin Glasp and my Sister Elizabeth Glasp
and their Heirs forever,

And whereas there hath been two Negroes sold out of my Estate, Viz: Dick and Harry
for forty Pounds each, I do give the said Principals

the two Negroes are Uncooled or added in the room of the said two
same either Eighty four in currency or two Negroes added to my
Brother William Glap and Nephew Belfield (here and is above)
every particular as the afore mentioned Negroes, Adam, Will, Donah and Sarah,
I give to my Brother William Glap my largest feather Bed and its furniture
I give to my Nephew Belfield (and my other feather Bed and its furniture)

Item. I Will and Desire that all the Remainder of my Estate both Real and personal shall
Equally Divided between my Brother William Glap and Nephew Belfield have and
their heirs forever. And if either Dies without heirs then the Part of the deceased to be to
the survivor, and if they both die without heirs then the same to be to my Brother in
Law Benjamin Cave and Elizabeth Cave and their heirs forever

Item. I Nominate, Constitute and Appoint my Beloved Brother in Law Benjamin Cave
to be my sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament; Utterly Revoking disallowing
and disannulling all former or other Wills, Testaments and Bequest whatsoever. And
Witnessing this and only this to be my last Will and Testament, In Testimony whereof
I do hereunto set my hand and Seal the Day and Year above Written
