 Body I commit to the Earth to be decently buried at the
 Direction of my Executors hereafter named

Imprimis I Give unto my beloved Brother Adam Gar Two
 Hundred Acres of Land out of a Tract of four Hundred Acres
 to be taken of with a Crope line lying under the foot of
 the rackit Mountain upon Gules River unto him and his
 Heirs forever

Imprimis I Give unto my beloved Wife Dorothea Gar Two
 hundred and fifty Acres of Land with the Plantation where
 I now do live

hundred and fifty Acres of Land with the Plantation
I now to live. He after her Decease if she not Marry but
case she should Marry she is to stay no longer. Tell my Son
John is of of Age. I Give and bequeath unto my beloved
One hundred and fifty Acres of Land out of a Tract of Two
hundred and Ninety Acres which I Possess in my own Right
Tittle on the South River of Shannondock. Tell after his
Decease

I Give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Dorothea all
Personall Estate or Goods and Chattels Tell after his Decease
if in case she doth not Marry but if she doth Marry then
is to have The third Part of all my Personall Estate or Goods
and Chattels and I also give unto my beloved Wife Dorothea
one Servent Boy unto her and her Heirs and the said Servent
is to have one year free of his Servitude

Impairment I give and bequeath unto my beloved Son John
Gar and Andrew Gar the Tract of Land whereon I now to live
with the Plantation and Houses to Gatter and two Tracts

of Land more Chining to the said Tract to Gather containing
Four hundred and Fifty Acres of Land to be Equally Divided
between my above said two Sons to them their Heirs forever
and my above said son John is to have the first Choice of the
Land
I also Give unto my son John one Riffil Gun to him and
his Heirs forever

Inpeimms I Give unto my beloved Daughter Elizabeth Gae
Two hundred Acres of Land to be taken of a Tract of Four
hundred Acres which I Reserve unto her and her Heirs forever
the said Land lying and being under the foot of the Rackets
Mountain upon Huppes River

Inpeimms I Give unto my beloved Daughter Eve Gae
one hundred and fifty Acres of Land of the said my Tract
to be taken of Two hundred and Ninety Acres unto her her
Heirs forever and after my beloved wife Dorothy Gae deceas
the said my Daughter Eve Gae is to have the hole tract of
my Two hundred and Ninety Acres of Land unto her her Heirs
forever

the said my Daughter we gave to her the sum of
my Two hundred and Ninety Acres of Land unto her heirs
for ever living and being in Augusta County on the West
Side of Shannondoh

And I Will that all my Personal Estate in Goods and in the
be equally Divided between My said Daughters of
my Wife Dorothea her Decause to Marriage

Lastly I make and Ordain my beloved Wife Dorothea
and my beloved Brother Adam her Executor of this my
Last Will and Testament Revoking all other Wills by me

made and in Witness that this is my Last Will and
Testament I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this
