to God for the same and Calling to Mind the uncertainty of this Life do make &
Declare this my last Will & Testament in Manner & form following
In witness whereof I Recommend my soul to God who gave it firmly believing that through
the Merits of Jesus Christ my dear Redeemer to Obtain perfect Pardon &
forgiveness of all my Sins my Body to be Buried at the discretion of my Executors
hereafter named & what Worldly Goods it hath Pleased God to bestow on me I Give
& bequeath in the following Manner

Item I Leave to my loving Wife Elizabeth one fourth part of my Estate (except to my Lands)
for and during her Natural Life & at her decease to be equally Divided Amongst
my Children then living to them & their Heirs forever.

Item I Leave to my said loving Wife Elizabeth the tract of Land whereon I now live
Containing by Estimation Two hundred & forty seven Acres for and during her
Natural Life & after her Decease I Give the same to my Son Richard Coleman
Pollard to him & his Heirs forever.

Item I Give to my son Robert Pollard all the rest of my Lands not before Giving Containing
by Estimation Two hundred Acres being the Land purchased of Spawoods
Estate to him & his Heirs forever.

Item All the Rest & Residue of my Estate not before Giving I Give to my five Children to wit
Elizabeth, Robert, Sarah, Milley, & Richard Coleman Pollard to be Equally Divided
between them & their Heirs forever.

Lastly I do hereby Constitute & Appoint my trusty Friends William Williams
Samuel Clayton Jun^r & Edward Wat^r Executors of this my last Will &
and hereby Revoking a

ie granted him for Obtaining a Probate thereof in due form to have Power to the
same & given Bond & Security according to Law, Liberty being reserved for the
other Executors to join in the Probate when they shall think fit.
