for the same I do make and Ordain this my last
Will and Testament in Manner & form following
that is to say first I commend my Soul To
Almighty God hoping to receive pardon and
Pardon of all my sins through the Merits of my
Saviour Jesus Christ and my Body to be buried
in a Christian Manner at the Discretion of my
Executors hereafter mentioned and for what
Worldly goods God in his Mercy shall be pleased
to bestow on me I give and Bequeath the same
as followeth that is to say it is my Will that all
my just Debts and Funeral Expenses be first
satisfied and paid

that is to say first I recommend my Soul to
Almighty God hoping to receive pardon and
Remission of all my Sins through the Merits of

fall to the other sister

Item My will is that my Children should be well brought up at
the discretion of my Executors

Item I give unto my Wife Margret Covington all the rest of my
Estate during her life and after her decease all to be Equally
Divided among my Children, My Will is that John Strother
William Covington and Anthony Strother should be my
Executors This is my last Will and Testament leaving
all other Will or Wills that are made or may be made
to which I have hereunto set my hand and seal this
10th day of October 1759.

At a Court held for the County of Culpeper on Thursday the 18th day of September 1766

This last Will and Testament of Robert Covington dec^d was exhibited to the Court by John Strother one of the executors therein named and was proved in the following manner John Clayton swore that he saw Decedent did sign Seal & publish this to be his last Will & Testament & that he saw William W. Herman one of the witnesses subscribe the same. And at a Court held for the said County on Thursday

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the 16th day of October 1766

The said Will was further proved by the Oath of Richard Covington another Witness thereto. Ordered to be Recorded and the said Will is to lie for the Executors to Qualify at the next Court

And at a Court held for the said County on Saturday the 22^d day of November 1766. On the Motion of John Strother Gent one of the Executors in the said Will mentioned Certificate is Granted him for obtaining a Probate thereof in due Form

between Lin & 1/2 with the Appurtenances therunto belonging

now live together with the Appurtenances therunto belonging
where of all my Horse, Mares, Colts, two mares, saddle & harness
and one best Bed & furniture, with what meat & drink I shall see

Item My Will and desire is that my tract of Land which lies of
William Green on the branch of Mountain Run & Muddy Run in
Hemlock Mountain together with my two Lots purchased of the
Colonian in the said Town numbered seven & thirty five in a plan of
the said Town, be sold by my Executors hereafter mentioned.

Item My further Will and desire is that the two thirds of my Estate be divided
between my beloved wife Elizabeth & my beloved Daughters Ann Tave
& Sarah Titt, to them & their heirs forever, the Lot of Land left my
Wife, after her decease to be equally divided between my said Daughters
& their Representatives

Lastly I do hereby constitute & appoint my trusty & beloved friends Wm.
Brown, William Williams, & John Green Gentlemen Executors of this
my last Will & Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set
my Hand & Seal this fifth day of December 1766.
