Then I give to my Son Robert Toole my Lot where I
now live

Then I give to my Son John Toole one black Man
named Blase and my Gun

I give to my Daughter Sarah Toole four pounds Ten
Shilling in Brownfield Longs Hands as the Mayor says
that I sold him if she likes to take her again

Then I give all the Remains of my Estate not before
mentioned to be equally divided between my loving

Wife Margret Toole and my three Children Robert
Toole Sarah Toole and John Toole after my Debts

and funeral expences is payed I do appoint my Son
Robert Toole and my Daughter Sarah Toole my

Executors of this my last Will and Testament In Witness
Whereunto set my Hand and Seal

Linn and Mary Carter Cohears at Law of the Decedent
