It is my Desire that my just Debts and funeral Expences be first paid. Item it is my Desire that the
Land and Slaves in the possession of Elizabeth Fargeson Widow of my Son Francis Fargeson
Deceased be disposed of in the manner he directed by his Will Item I Give and
Bequeath to my Son Samuel Fargeson all the rest and residue of my Lands to him and
and his heirs forever. Reserving to my beloved wife Ann in the Use of the Plantation where
I now live during her Natural life. Also reserving to my Daughter Elizabeth Fargeson
Liberty to work on the said Plantation what Slaves she shall be possessed of During
the Time she remains Single. Item I lend to my said Daughter Elizabeth During her
Natural life the use of the following Slaves to wit one young woman Lett and one
for Tom with the Increase, and After her Decease it is my Desire the said Slaves and
Increase be valued that my Son Samuel hold the said Slaves as his property on his
Saying to my two Daughters Sanna Daniel and Ann the wife of Francis Brother and
Benjamin Fargeson the son of my Son Francis Fargeson Deceased on their respective
heirs three fourths of the Value of the said Slaves in Equal Portions Between them.
Item I lend to my Daughter Lucy the wife of John Graves During her Natural life
the use of the following Slaves to wit one Girl Rachel and one boy James and that
she should leave any Child or Children at her Death I Give the said Slaves to

them but if she should not leave any lawfull Issue after her Decease Give the said
Slaves to my son Samuel Fargerson and his heirs forever Item I lend to my daughter
Elizabeth Daniel during her natural life the use of one negroe girl Ann
with her Increase and in case she should leave any lawfull Issue of her Body
Give the same to be Equally Divided Between them but if she should die without
leaving such Issue it is then my Desire that said Slave and Increase be valued the
my son Samuel hold the said Slave as his property on his paying to my wife
Daughter Susanna Daniel and my Brother and my Grandson Benjamin
Fargerson on their respective heirs three fourths of the value of the said Slave and
Increase in Equal Portions Between them Item I lend to my Daughter Susanna
Daniel During her natural life the use of one negroe Boy Joseph, and in
case she should marry and have Issue of the same then Give the said
Slave to be divided between them But if she should have no future Issue of her Body
then (after her Decease) Give the said Slave to my son Samuel and his heirs forever

The Court held for the County of Culpeper on Monday the 1st day of May 1772.

This Last will and Testament of Samuel Fargeson deceased was exhibited to the Court by Samuel Fargeson one of the Executors therein named and was proved by the Oath of Henry Fenderson and James Fenderson Witnesses thereto and Ordered to be Recorded and on the motion of the said Executor Certificate is granted herefor Obtaining a Probate thereof in due form he having sworn to the same and Given Bonds and Security According to Law liberty being reserved the Other Executor to Qualify when shown to the Court.
