Guilford being sick & weak of Body but in perfect sense & Memory
thanks be to Almighty God for the same and being desirous to
settle my Affairs before I depart this life I give my soul into the

hands of Almighty God who gave it me fully trusting in the merits
of my Redeemer Christ for a full and gracious pardon of all my former
Sins and Iniquities & my Body to the Earth from whence it was taken
to be buried in a decent and Christian-like manner, and as to
what worldly goods which it hath pleased God to bestow on me
after my Just Debts and Funeral expenses are first paid I Give &
Bequeath in the following manner viz

Imparting I leave to the use of my well beloved wife Elizabeth Oxford
my Lot of Land and Plantation whereon I now live together with
the four following slaves ^{Culpeper County, Virginia Wills}

for during her natural life, and after her decease I Give & Bequeath
the same and all the same above mentioned Estate to my Daughter
Molley Jennings to be by her freely held and enjoyed & after her decease
my Will and desire is that the same be divided between my
Daughter Elizabeth that is or may be hereafter born of her Body
in such a manner as my Son in Law Augustus Jennings shall think

in such a manner as my son-in-law Augustin Jennings should think
Just and convenient.

I Herby Give & Bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Jennings One
Heir forever one negro Woman named Bett, also one other negro
Girl named Bett which she hath already received as a former
gift together with such other of my estate as she hath already
Received with the Increase.

I Herby Give and Bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Elizabeth
Jennings One Heir forever one negro Woman named Bett One Increase to
be delivered to her at the time of her Marriage or coming of age
I Herby Give & Bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Hannah Jennings
One Heir forever one negro Girl named Bett One Increase to be delivered
to her at the time of her Marriage or coming of age.

I Herby Give unto my Grandson Thomas Asford Jennings one
negro Boy named Moses to him and his Heir forever but if
either of the above mentioned Grand Children should die with-
out Heir leave their Legacy to be divided between the rest of my
said Daughters Children at the Will & Discretion of the aforesaid

Girl named Bett which she hath already received as a former
gift together with such other of my estate as she hath already
Received with the Increase

Item I give and Bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Elizabeth
Jennings & her Heir one Negroe Girl named Bett This Increase to
