I give to my said Wife Ann Burke except the Bed that we called Sarah's Bed
which I give to my Daughter Sarah Burke beside her Equal part of the rest of
my Estate. It is my Will that my said Wife shall keep that Estate

and Negro Wench Samor and her increase if any and all my other Estate shall
be sold and Equally divided Among all my Children that so there always be

desire that my said Wife shall pay of all my just Debts and lastly I make
and Ordain my Wife Ann Burke to be Executor of this my last Will and Testament
as Witness I the said Thomas Burke the Testator do Acknowledge this to be
