Whole Estate Real & Personal And during of her Natural Life And Widowhood
And at her Death or Second Marriage, I Dispose of the Same in Manner following
Secondly, I give And Bequeath unto my Beloved Son Anthony Griffin One
Horse Coll. of a straw body Roan Culler, by the name Derrick And one
cow & calf, to him his Heirs & assigns for Ever, to be Delivered to him
at my above s^d Loving wifes Death, or Second Marriage, or when she
pleases

Thirdly After the Death or Second marriage of said Loving wife, I give
 & Bequeath unto my Beloved Son Zaccariah Griffin the Tract or parcel of
 Land whereon I now live, And one feather Bed, And one cow & half to him
 his heirs for ever

Fourthly I give and Bequeath unto my Beloved Daughter Elizabeth Song
 one cow & half to her and Her heirs for ever

Fifthly I give and Bequeath unto Elizabeth Henney a young women that
 I and my wife have Raised one cow & half to her & her heirs for ever

Sixthly As I have Sold three Hundred & fourteen Acres of Land forming
 the Ridge of Mountain, in the County of Culpeper to Wth George Witherall
 and have never made a Lawfull right to him for the same and
 if I should die before I have an Opportunity to do it, I do by this Will
 give and Bequeath the said Tract and parcel of Land to him his
 heirs & assigns for ever

Seventhly After the Death or Second Marriage of my Beloved wife

Seven thly) After the Death or Second Marriage of my Belov'd Wife
I give and Bequeath unto my Several Children whose names are here
mentioned the Rest of my whole Estate Real And personal to be Equally
Divided Between Mary Peters, Anthony Griffin Elizabeth Long Zarahiah
Griffin to them their heirs and assigns for ever, and if any of my above said
Children should die without a Heir Lawfully Begotten, or that then the part of
my s^d Estate that they should have or would have fallen to them to be Equally Divided
Among them that shall be Living And the Lawfull Heirs of Such as may be Dead at the
time of such Division.

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Eightly) and Lastly, I do constitute and appoint my Two Sons Anthony Griffin and
Zarahiah Griffin Executors of this my Last Will and Testament, hereby Revoking
all other wills heretofore made by me, Acknowledging this to be my Last will &
Testament In Witness whereof I do Here unto set my hand & Seal this Ninth day
of February in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred Eighty One
