negro Boy named Sam to him & his Heirs forever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my loving Wife my whole
personal Estate to dispose of as she shall think proper.

Lastly I Desire that my loving Wife her Executors

shall be my Executors to this my last Will & Testament.
