and County of Culpeper being of a sound and perfect mind and memory
thanks be to Almighty God for the same do make and Ordain this my
last Will and Testament in manner and form following viz
I Bequeath my precious and Immortal soul to Almighty God who gave it
in full hope of Pardon and Remission for all my past sins and Trans-
gressions thro' the merits and mediation of my most compassionate
Redeemer Jesus Christ my Body to be decently Buried at the discretion
of my Executors hereafter named and as to such worldly estate wherewith
hath pleased God to Bless me I dispose of the same as follows

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Item I give and bequeath unto my well beloved son Charles
Duncan Twenty five pounds I give to him and his heirs forever
Item I give and bequeath to my well beloved son James Duncan all
that tract of Land on which I now live with the appurtenances as
also my Desk and Book case to him and his heirs forever

Item my Will and desire is that all the Residue of my Estate be sold to
the highest Bidder at six months credit and the money arising there-
from
