I Williams History of Culpeper County in Virginia being very sick and weak in body but in perfect mind and Memory thanks be to God for it causing to mind the mortality of my body and knowing it is appointed for all men once to Die do make and Ordain this my Last will and Testament that is to principally and First of all I give and Recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it and ~~and my body to the ground~~ to be Buried in a Christian like manner at the Discretion of Executors nothing Doubting but to receive it again at the General Resurrection by the Power of God and as touching my worldly Estate as it hath Pleas'd God to bless me with in this life I give Demise and Dispose of the same in the following Manner and form

After my Lawfull Debts being paid I do give and bequeath my whole Estate to my four Daughters Ann Dorothy Elizabeth and Mary the Estate to be kept together and the Plantation till the Girls Marry to

abolished in like manner at the Discretion of Executors nothing  
Doubting but to recover it again at the General Resurrection by  
the Power of God and as touching my worldly Estate as it hath Pleas'd  
God to bless me with in this life I give Devise and Dispose of the  
same in the following Manner and form

After my Lawfull Debts being paid I do give and bequeath my whole  
Estate to my four Daughters Ann Dorothy Elisabeth and Nancy the  
Estate to be kept together Gulpeper County, Virginia Wills

the age of Eighteen years and as they come to that age or they should  
Marry they should receive their Part and when the Youngest comes  
of age or Marries then she to receive Equal what the others has  
received then if the Estate has Gained any thing more than it was  
Appraised to at first that to be Equally Divided amongst the  
said four Girls and if any one should Die without her Part  
to be Equally Divided amongst the surviving ones

I have likewise constituted and appointed Roger Mallery Nathaniel Mallery  
Berry Baker David Baker Executors of this my last Will and Testament  
and I do hereby utterly Disallow all other Will or Wills and I do hereby  
confirm this my last Will and Testament I Witness whereof I have set  
my hand and seal the day and year first above Written signed
