In the Name of God AMEN I William Pannillo
being very sick and in a languishing Condition but
in perfect sense and memory blessed be God for it
But calling to mind the Uncertainty of this life I
humbly Commit my Soul to Almighty God that gave
it me through the Merits of his only Son Jesus Christ
our Lord and my Body to be decently buried at
the Direction of my Executors hereafter mentioned
And as for my worldly Goods that God has been pleased
to bestow upon me I give in Manner following vizt
Item I give unto my Beloved Wife Sarah Pannillo
my Bay Horse called Jacob

Item my Desire is that my youngest Son Joseph
Pannillo when he arrives to the age of Twenty four
Years shall have eighty Pounds Current Money to be
paid proportionally by his four elder Brothers vizt
Samuel Pannillo William Pannillo David Pannillo and

paid proportionally by the persons
Samuel Pennell William Pennell David Pennell and
John Pennell

Then I give to my Daughter Frances Pennell
Thirty Pounds Current Money at day of Marriage
or when she shall arrive to the Age of Twenty Year
Then I give to my sons Samuel Pennell & John Pennell
all the Land that I bought of William Strother to be
equally divided between them both in Quantity
and Quality to them and their Heirs lawfully
begotten forever

Then I give to my sons William Pennell and
David Pennell all the Land that I bought of
Maj^r Toiles on lying in Orange County to be
equally divided between them both in Quantity
and Quality to them and their Heirs lawfully
begotten forever

Item my Devise is that if any one of my Sons
 that I have given my Land to should die without
 their lawfully begotten then his Part of the Land
 to fall to my youngest Son Joseph Pannill and
 not to have any part of the Money before intended for
 him

Item my Devise is that when my Children shall
 come to the Age of Twenty one Years they shall
 make choice of one Man and then with this
 Part of this Will they shall divide the Negroes
 and all my other Moveable Estate into as many
 equal Parts and shall have Children then alive
 and each Child to have an equal Part

I do hereby appoint my Well beloved Wife Sarah
 Pannill and Samuel Pannill my Son Executors
 and Executor of this my last Will and Testament
 revoking all other As Witness my Hand
