would be a minor as will be of the value of one thousand pounds with
reference to time of my death, my sons Joseph and Littleberry shall jointly
contribute to the said William as much as will make up the value of
one thousand pounds including such contribution provided however that no
subject or mismanagement of the said land his heirs or assigns shall have de-
void such disappoiment it is my will also that all my slaves our
personal Estate except Teller York Bitty & Chico herein before disposed of
be distributed agreeably to the act of distribution such slaves as I may
at the time of my death have given to any of my children being accounted
for in such distribution but as it is my primary will and desire that
the most speedy provision to be made for the payment and discharge of
the debts which I may owe at the time of my death and that the same
be done equitably as it may effect the real and personal property
herein divided and bequeathed I direct that the two plantations serve
to my two sons Joseph & Littleberry together with all slaves except in
your disposal also the stocks & utensils employed on the said plantations
at the time of my death be kept together under the direction of my Executors
until two crops be made including that which may be growing at the time
of that event and that the proceeds of such crop be apoted in the hands of
my Executors in aid of the debts due to me towards discharging hem
and fully those which I may owe but in the mean time my sons Joseph
and Littleberry to be allowed out of the proceeds reasonable sums for their
support at the directions of my Executors including the education of
Littleberry as aforesaid and to the funds for paying my debts I direct my Executors
to will and convey in full simple my lots and houses in the Town of Carter-
ville. I constitute my Brother Edward Carrington and my friend Doctor James

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Wilson Executors of this my last Will and Testament, In witness whereof

of health in body but sound in mind, do make this my last will and
Testament; my first my will is that all my just debts be paid. I give
and bequeath to my son Peter, three hundred & thirty Acres of land lying
in the County of Buckingham on Joshua's Creek, it being one branch
of slate River, likewise one negro man named Silas, also one feather bed &
furniture also two Cows & Calves and one yoke of young Oxen also one chest
one Table, six chairs, ten dollars worth of pewter & one small Iron Pot, likewise
three Cives, other horse which he has now in possession, for him also
hers forever. I stand unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Guerrant (the tract
of land with the plantation wherein I now live) during her natural life
and at her death, my will is for it to be sold, and one hundred pounds of
the money arising from the sale, I give to my daughter Magdalene, and one
hundred pounds of the money arising from the sale, I give to my daughter Lucy

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And the balance of the money arising from the sale of the land I give to my son Thomas Peter likewise I give to my son Thomas Peter one negroman, Jack, also one feather bed and furniture, also two cows & calves, & one yoke of young Oxen, also one chest one Table, six chairs two dollars worth of pewter, some small Iron pot likewise three Cives, and the horse that he has now in possession for him to his heirs forever. I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth one feather bed and furniture, also one cow & calf for her other heirs forever. I give & bequeath to my Daughter Magdalene besides the one hundred pounds above mentioned one Negro girl named Nancy also one feather bed & furniture, also two cows & calves & one yoke of young Oxen, also one chest one Table, six chairs two dollars worth of pewter & one small Iron pot also three Cives, & one small bay mare, for her & her heirs forever. I give to my beloved wife Elizabeth Guerrant, three cows & calves, one yoke of Oxen, & three Cives & a sorrel mare other youngest colt which is now two years old, for her & her heirs forever likewise I bind to my beloved wife, during her natural life all the residuary estate not herein disposed off and at her death I give it to be equally divided between all my children, my daughter Elizabeth excepted. And I do hereby constitute, ordain, and appoint my son Peter and my son in law Abner Watkins the whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal the thirtieth day of May in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and two.


