

I William Powell of the State of Virginia and County of Cumberland do hereby make my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say, 1<sup>st</sup> I give to my son Henry the tract of land wherein I now live including the land I bought of James Douglass together with the following slaves to wit, Hall, Davy, Phill, Robin, Marcia & Bet to him and his heirs forever. - 2<sup>d</sup> I give to my son William the tract of Land I bought of Thomas Hobson together with the following slaves to wit, Wilches, James, J<sup>r</sup>, J<sup>s</sup>, Sally & Maria to him and his heirs forever, 3<sup>rd</sup> I give to my daughter Linton one thousand pounds in money to her and her heirs forever 4<sup>th</sup> I give to my daughter Nedbet one thousand pounds in money to her and her heirs forever. The interest of the above and two thousand pounds it is presumed will be sufficient to educate & maintain my two daughters during their minority without breaking the principal. -

5<sup>th</sup> In order to raise the aforesaid ten thousand pounds (in aid to the debt that may be due to me) I desire that the following property may be sold with all the stock of every kind, household and kitchen furniture plantation utensils &c and whatever balance may remain (after paying my just debts) I desire may be equally divided between my two sons. - - -

6<sup>th</sup> If either of my sons should die before he comes to age I desire that the surviving son should have his land and the rest of his Estate be equally divided

between my two daughters; and if either of my daughters should die before  
she marries or comes of age, I desire that her portion may be equally divided  
between my surviving children. I do hereby constitute and  
ordain my friends Charles Woodson, Samuel Atkinson, Nathan Wilson  
& William Woodson as will executors of this my last will and  
testament, as guardians to my aforesaid children. In testimony


