rooms in the East end of the House, the Yard and the Garden in
common with herself —

3rd I give and bequeath to my son Henry the use of my House,
Yard and Garden as beforementioned, also all profits arising
from the trade carried on by him in my name in the town of
Cartersville, and all the Interest, Stock or Profits that may be
accruing ~~to~~ due to me for my share in the late concern of
Hughes, Allen & Co. at Cairo.

4th It is my will and desire that my two lots in Car-
tersville now occupied by Thomas Walton and E. Macquillan
be sold after the expiration of the present year on a liberal
credit, and that the remainder of my effects, with any
perishable property not otherwise disposed of, may be sold

6th It is my will and desire that after the termination of my Wifes estate, there shall be a sale of all the property which is herein given to her for the term of her widowhood, together with all the other property I may die possessed of, and not otherwise disposed of, and the proceeds of the sale, together with all other monies or debts arising from my Estate, be distributed as follows — to the children of my Son Henry One third in equal portions to my son John Hughes one third to the children of my deceased Daughter Sally Mitchell the remaining third in equal portions —




