negroes named Maryland and Saylor together with
their future increase, and howe everdell two cows and
calves, and feather bed and furniture, half dozen knives
and forks, and dozen Queens China plates, two dishes. And
after the death of my wife Elizabeth Allen, I give him
two hundred and fifty acres of land part of the tract I
now live on, to be laid off as followeth viz

Beginning at the road on the stone point leading dry
creek, running over the ridge till it intersects dry creek
thence down it to Andersons line, thence along his line
to Elliston line, thence along his line to Benjamin Allens
line, thence along his line, and the mill Road to an
