First. Just debts be paid - I give and bequeath to my son Richmond Allen two negroes, named Robert, & Betsy together with all their future increase, with all the stock of every kind, brass hold and kitchen furniture and also Four hundred pounds, which cash & property aforesaid he has already received, I give to him and his heirs forever.

Secondly. I give and bequeath to my son William C. Allen two negroes named Maryland and Seylor together with their future increase, and horse & saddle, two cows and calves, and feather bed and furniture, half dozen knives and forks, and dozen Queens China plates, two dishes. And after the death of my wife Elizabeth Allen, I give him two hundred and fifty acres of land part of the tract I now live on, to be laid off as follows to wit:

Beginning at the road on the stone point near dry creek, running and the ridge till it intersects dry creek thence down it to Anderson line, thence along his line to cotton line, thence along his line to Benjamin Allen's line, thence along his line, and the mill Road to an old sawpit near the corner of my field, and from thence to the Beginning, so as to include the said two hundred and fifty acres land, all which I give to him and his heirs forever.

Thirdly. I give and bequeath to my son Edward C. Allen two negroes namely Jack & Ginny together with their future increase and horse & saddle, two cows & calves, & feather bed & furniture, half dozen knives & forks, one dozen Queens China plates, two dishes, & one hundred pounds cash, all which he has already received, all which I give to him & his heirs forever,

Fourthly. I give and bequeath to my son John C. Allen two negroes

with the same proportion of stock and furniture given to my

Sixthly I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary C. Elliott five
negroes, namely, Middy Maria, Wiley, Sucky and
William together with all their future increase and also
all the furniture already received from me, all which I
give to her and her heirs forever

Seventhly I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth C. Penick
five negroes namely, Middy, Betty, Martha, and one
Pleasant, together with their future increase and also
such furniture in every respect as I have given my
daughter Mary C. Elliott which my executors hereafter
named are requested to give her, all which I give to her and
her heirs forever

Eighthly I give and bequeath to my daughter Sally W. Allen five negroes
namely, Maria, Abby, Sady, Phoeby and William, together
with their future increase and also the same kind of furniture
as I have given to my other Daughters, which my executors
hereafter named, are requested to give her, all which I give to
her and her heirs forever. But should my said ^{daughter} Sally W.
Allen, depart this life leaving no lawful issue then in that
case it is my will and desire that all the property herein
said to be given to my said Daughter Sally W. Allen and
also all that part that may be allotted to my said Daughter
(after the decease of my wife) shall return to my estate &
be equally divided among all my other children should
share alike, which I give to them and their heirs forever

Ninthly I give and bequeath to my Daughter Martha W. Allen five
negroes namely, Dancy, Pancer, Sucky, Pitter & Phill together
with their future increase, and further bed & furniture one
Bridle and Saddle and such other furniture as is devised to my
