Parish of Southdown and County of Cumberland being of sound
perfect and disposing mind sense and memory do make certain
testaments and appoint this to be my last will and Testament
in witness whereof I follow in. First it is my Will that my
body be decently entred at the direction of my Executors
hereafter named and as to what worldly estate it hath pleased
God to bestow upon me I give and dispose thereof in Manner
following

I give and bequeath unto my Son Littlebirney Morby
and his heirs for ever all my Land lying in Southdown County

I have all my goods and chattels in the house
I bought of Philip Smith and also two horses, two
Phill Smith and his two children. I have also a silver
Wagon of four good horses and a wagon of iron and other
things and things in and about the house called the
new house as my four sons and I have bought of Silver &
Watch.

I have also my wife Mary during her natural life
or widowhood the use of my following things (writ) of German
Jack beds, Seachey, Pottery and Harminah also three back
Rooms in the house called the Ordinary, a small house
called the Store a small house called the dairy, the building
added to my Kitchen and my small fire place. I have
also lent unto my said ^{wife} during the Term aforesaid the use of
the following things (writ) three good Feather beds and furs
two and one bed called the box room three Tables one dozen
Leather Chairs of that a day and Chairs which said Beds
Tables and Chairs are to be taken out of the said House called
the Ordinary, also the Desk that stands in our Lodging Room &
one Chest I have lent unto my said wife during the Term aforesaid

the use of the following things to wit: six good horses twelve
other cattle all my flock of hogs all my flock of sheep my
large riding chair and two houses one half kettle three iron pots
half a dozen Peewee Dishes two dozen Peewee Plates one dozen or
earthen Plates one dozen Tea Cups & saucers half a dozen Delft
Bowls half a dozen Bone Knives half a dozen Silver Teas-
poons one Tea Pot one Tea Kettle one Cart and Wheels such a
Plantation Utensils as she shall have occasion for and such
other necessities as I may have forgot not
exceeding the value of three pounds the use of which things
above mentioned I intend in lieu of my wife's right of dower
in my estate.

I give unto and bequeath unto my son Peindexter Mosby
and his heirs forever all the lands I have professed them with to
wit the lands I bought of Broadson of Backstall and the land
I lately received of Daniel and those adjoining the
lands of Thomas Langhorne and others I have given and bequeath
unto my said son Peindexter every Slave of whom I have any other thing
I have is now possessed of by virtue of any gift or loan
from me or of any common work houses and my Saddle
and Bridle.

I give unto my Daughter Mary Ann Netherland
all her share for ever every share and other estate of
my husband in kind as well as she is more possessed of by Virtues
my gift I leave from me also a common Horse

I give unto my Daughter Theodora Harrington
all her share of the New Negroes I possessed her with also
my Negroes John Dick and young Milly also all the
household Furniture I have possessed her with and a com-
mon work horse

I give unto my Grand Daughter Netherland and
her heirs for ever my Negro Woman Patsy & her Child.

I give unto my Grand Daughter Elizabeth
Netherland and her heirs for ever my Negro Girl Patsy
but if my said Grand Daughter should die without Issue then
I give the said Patsy to her Father John Netherland.

I give unto my son John Littlebury of Princeton
my wearing apparel after giving Seth Peckham a full
suit of my common clothes.

I give unto my Son Littlebury Mosby all my plantation Utensils
except such as I have lent him Mother also all the money I
may be possessed of and all my out standing debts he paying

may die possessed of and all my out standing debts he paying
all the debts I may owe at the time of my decease.

I Give unto Peleguath every part of my estate of what Nature or
kind soever not already given or lent to be equally divided immediately
after my decease among my Children Littlebury, Peirce Dexter, Mary
Ann & Theodora all share alike.

I Give unto Peleguath after my Wife's decease or Marriage all the
Slaves and every other thing and things of what Nature or kind soever
to be equally divided among my Children Peirce Dexter, Mary Ann
Theodora and their heirs forever.

I Will that my Estate be not Oppressed and that if
any disputes should arise among my Children concerning any
of my estate they be given them that they and in such case

this be the last and full Will.

At a Court held for Cumberland County the 21st September 1798
This last will and Testament of Benjamin Montgomery deceased was
exhibited in court by William Montgomery, Son of the said Montg. and
Joseph Harrington one of the executors therein named and the same
was proved by John Weston and Thompson Loomis two of
the Witnesses thereto and ordered to be Read the said will in the words
of the said Executor who made oath according to his certificate
is granted them for bearing as proper Asset in due form giving
Security Whereupon they together with George Harrington
their Security entered into bond according to Law and
Liberty is reserved to the other Executor to join in probat.
