land lying and being in Pickens county being eight hundred acres to be
equally divided between them according to quantity and quality to them
and their heirs and assigns forever. I give to my son James
Coleman one hundred acres of land part of the tract I now live on to be
laid off so as not to interfere with my plantation and to have the plan-
tation in it as he lives on to him and his heirs and assigns forever.
I give to my sons Daniel Robert Benjamin and William Coleman
the sum of eighty pounds a piece to be raised out of my estate. I give
to my son William Coleman one feather bed & furniture. I give
to my son Joseph Coleman one feather bed and furniture. I give

to my son Bury Coleman my large farm I give to my daughter Lucy
Barnes and the negro girl named Harriet to her and her heirs I should give
to my daughter Elizabeth Allen one negro girl named Jenn to her and
her heirs. My will and desire is that all the rest of my estate shall
remain in the possession of my loving wife Patience Coleman as long as
she shall live to support her and raise the legacies that I have willed
away and at her death I give the land where on I now live to my son Joseph
Coleman to him and his heirs and assigns forever. All the rest of my of my
estate I leave to be equally divided between all my children Stephen James
Daniel Spilley Robert Benjamin William and Joseph Coleman Lucy
Barnes and Elizabeth Allen and if either of my children should die
before they come to the age of twenty one years my desire is that their
parts shall be equally divided between the surviving children and I do
appoint my loving wife Patience Coleman Stephen Coleman Robert
Coleman Joseph Coleman and Bury A. Nelson executors and admors and
trustees of this my last will and testament as witness my hand this
twenty six day of June one thousand seven hundred & seventy two.
