

I Daniel Jones of the county of Cumberland do make my last will and testament as follows
I leave to my wife Judith one third part of my estate real and personal during her natural
life except my land in New Kent county. I give to my son Daniel Jones ~~crimmins~~ ^{crimmins} ~~land~~ ^{land}
tract of land in New Kent county upon Ware creek containing one hundred and some 60 acres
It is my will and desire that the residue of my estate be kept together and the other two
thirds of my slaves worked on the other two thirds of my land in Cumberland ^{county} for the
maintaining and educating my children 'til my son Daniel Jones shall come to the age
of twenty one years. My will and desire is that my wife be valued and that my son
Frederick keep the shell and allow the valuation out of his part of the estate. At which
time I give my said land in Cumberland county to be divided according to quantity
among my three sons Daniel Frederick and Walter and their heirs as tenants in common
but I do not mean that my wife's right in one third the said land should cease by such
division but that third part her as above shall be the right and title of my son Walter
his heirs theirs when her title thereto cease or the division of the slaves equal to the life term
in which case I direct the said land her shall work on the whole as my field in the same
shall be and convenient with the other slaves until the term said division is to be full
It is my will and desire that at the time the said division is made the said land to be
valued shall be valued by three proper persons to be appointed by the court and the amount
of such valuation I gave among my daughters Mary, Elizabeth and Susan and
equally divided and to be taken out of the residue of my estate according to the value
