of Lockhart Creek in Buckingham County to be equally divided
between them and their heirs for ever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son John Le'Vine two hun-
dred acres of land lying James bequeaths to him and his heirs
forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Martell Le'Vine all the
Land after his Mother's Death, whereon I now live, to him
and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Martell Le Sueur all the
Land after his Mother's Death, whereon I now live, to him
and his heirs for ever, provided he shall pay, to his brother

Children, I lend her the Stock and furniture which I live dur-
ing life.

Item I give to my son James one Negroe Man Jack.

Item I give to Robert Thompson my son in law one Negroe named
Phillis Jun^r.

Item I give to my son Chaatain one Negroe man named Moe.

Item I give to my son Samuel one Negroe boy named Henry.

Item I give to my son Peter one Negroe boy named Sam^l Esq^r of Robert
Le Sueur.

Item I give to my Daughter Elizabeth one Negroe boy named Major.

Item I give to my son Jell Le Sueur one Negroe boy named Sam^l.

Item I give to Robert Thompson my son in law one Negro named Phillis Junr.

Item I give to my son Chaatara one Negro man named Ned.

Item I give to my son Samuel one Negro boy named Harry.

Item I give to my son Peter one Negro boy named Jack (the of John's Labourer).

Item I give to my Daughter Elizabeth one Negro boy named Major.

Item I give to my son Tell one Negro boy named Matt.

Item I give to my son Martell one Negro boy named Charles.

Item It is my will and desire that all the remainder of my Negroes
