In the name of God amen I Daniel Mose being sick and weak but of a perfect and sound memory thanks be given to almighty God for it am willing to make this my last will and testament in manner and form following. First I give my soul to god who gave it me and my body to the earth from whence it was taken to be decently buried according to the discretion of mine executors.

Then I give and bequeath to my son William Mose five shillings sterling.

Then I give and bequeath to my son Joseph Mose one gray mare one dish and two pointer plates and one small iron pott and three further spoons to him and his heirs for ever.

Then I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Mose all my wearing clothes to her and her heirs forever.

Then I give and bequeath unto my son John Mose one feather bed one bolster and one new leather dish two plates three spoons one large iron pott and one pair of pott hobbs and one frying pan and one small chest one man's waistcoat three knives and three forks to him and his heirs forever.

Then I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Elizabeth Mose daughter of Joseph Mose one large chest one loom and gear two spinning wheels one iron mill and frying and one stone butter pott to her and her heirs forever.

My will and desire that my estate should not be appraised.

Now I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Mose all my wearing
clothes to her and her heirs forever.

Now I give and bequeath unto my son John Mose one feather bed bedstead
and one dresser desk two plates three spoons one large iron pot and
one pair of iron hooks and one frying pan and one small chest one man
saddle three knives and three forks to him and his heirs forever.

Now I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Elizabeth Mose daughter of
Joseph Mose one large chest one loom and gear two spinning wheels one
wain wheel and pegging and one stone butter mill to her and her heirs forever.

Now my will and desire that my estate should not be appraised

and that I all appoint my son Joseph Mose and my son John Mose
executors of this my last will and testament.
