

In the name of God Amen. I Drury Scruggs of Cumberland county being sick
body, but of perfect sense & memory, do make and declare this my last will & test-
ment in manner & form following, (to wit)

I give and bequeath to my son John Scruggs one negro woman named Jack, and two
girls, named Phillis & Rachel, and ^{my} two boys named Frank & Jacob, to him and his
heirs forever.

I give to my son Theodorick Scruggs one negro girl named Mennah, & one negro boy
named Dick, to him and his heirs forever.

I lend to my daughter Jane Barclay one negro woman named Rachel, & one negro
named Tom, & one negro girl named Phillis, during her life, and at her decease
be equally divided amongst all of her children. That is a lie.

I give to my son Drury Scruggs one negro fellow named Sam, & one negro girl
named Tillis to him and his heirs forever.

I give to my son Edward Scruggs, three hundred acres of land whereon I now live
after his mother's decease, also one negro boy named Will, to him & his heirs forever.

I lend to my daughter Anne Munton one negro girl named Hope, and one negro boy
named James, during her life, and at her decease to be equally divided amongst
her children and if she leaves no child to be equally divided amongst the rest
children.

I lend to my son Carter Scruggs the use of two negroes named Robin & Isiah
if he should recover another or her father's slaves, to him and his heirs forever,
and he should die without heir at his decease, to be equally divided between
son Edward Scruggs & my daughter Janny Scruggs.

son Bartholomew Scruggs & my daughter Fanny Scruggs.

I appoint my beloved wife as guardian to manage do and sell for my son Bartholomew and if she should die before my son Bartholomew Scruggs I appoint my son Edward Scruggs as guardian for him.

I lend to my daughter Fanny Scruggs two negroes, named Ben & Lucy, during life, and at her decease, to be equally divided amongst all her children, & if leaving no child, to be equally divided between my sons, Edward Scruggs and Bartholomew.

I do lend her a feather bed & furniture, and also one riding saddle value thirty pounds, and at her decease to be equally divided amongst all of her children, & if leaving no child to be equally divided as above mentioned between my sons Edward Scruggs & Bartholomew Scruggs.

I lend to my beloved wife Mary Scruggs during her natural life, or widowhood, land & plantation whereon I now live, with seven negroes (Primer, London, B. Pett, Sell, Sarah, and a boy named Harry, and all the remainder of my estate, and at the death or marriage of my wife my will and desire is that the negroes and personal estate should be equally divided by lot between my sons, Edward Scruggs and Bartholomew Scruggs & my daughter Fanny Scruggs.

Lastly I do hereby appoint my beloved wife Mary Scruggs, my sons John Scruggs, Edward Scruggs, executors of this my last will & testament, hereby attested, written, and making void all other wills & testaments, heretofore made. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this twenty ninth day of April one thousand seven

hundred and eighty two.

ing child, to be equally divided between my sons, Edward Scruggs and Barton
I also leave her a feather bed & furniture, and also one leather saddle value thirty
dollars, at her decease to be equally divided amongst all of her children, & if leaving
child to be equally divided as above mentioned between my sons Edward Scruggs
& Barton Scruggs.

I leave to my beloved wife Mary Scruggs during her natural life, or widowhood
land & plantation whereon I now live, with seven negroes (Primes, London, B.
Fatt, Tell, Sarah, and a boy named Mary, and all the remainder of my estate
at the death or marriage of my wife my will and desire is that the negroes and personal
estate, should be equally divided by lot between my sons, Edward Scruggs and Barton
Scruggs & my daughter Fanny Scruggs.

Lastly I do hereby appoint my beloved wife Mary Scruggs, my sons John Scruggs
Edward Scruggs, executors of this my last will & testament hereby attested, written
and making void all other wills & testaments, heretofore made In testimony whereof

At a court held for Cumberland county 26th August 1789.

His last will and testament of Henry Snuggs deceased was exhibited in court by Mary Snuggs executrix and John Snuggs and Edward Snuggs executors therein named persons Archibald Fletcher and John L'Wood two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded and on the motion of the said executrix and executors who made oath according to law certificate was granted them for obtaining a probat thereof in due form they having with Jesse Thorne and Theodorick Snuggs their securities entered into bond according to law.

I Daniel Jones of the county of Cumberland do make my last will and testament as full I leave to my wife Judith one third part of my estate real and personal during her natural life except my land in Kent Kent county. I give to my son Daniel Jones ^{and his heirs} a tract of land in Kent Kent county upon Wren creek containing one hundred and some odd acres. It is my will and desire that the residue of my estate be kept together and the other two thirds of my slaves worked on the other two thirds of my land in Cumberland ^{county} for the maintaining and educating my children 'til my son Daniel Jones shall come to the age of twenty one years. My will and desire is that my slave be valued and that my son Frederick keep the slave and allow the valuation out of his part of the estate. At which time I give my said land in Cumberland county to be divided according to quantity among my three sons Daniel Frederick and Walter and their heirs as tenants in common but I do not mean that my wife right in one third the said land shall be divided by such division but that third left her as above shall be the right and title of my son Walter
