my last will and testament in manner and form following viz
Item I give and bequeath unto my son John Hattens one

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Martha Six pounds
current money to her and her heirs.

Item I give and bequeath to my two grand Sons Sir John
Clay and Edward Clay two Negro Slaves Sam and Stager
and all their Increase now in their possession to be equally
divided between them when Edward shall arrive to the age
of twenty one — to them and to each of their heirs and
assigns forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son in law Francis
Wolley now in his possession two negroes viz. Frank and
James and their increase to him and to his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Anderson now
in her possession one negro girl named Tamar and her Increase also
ten pounds current money to her and to her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Martha Sir Francis current money to her and her heirs.

Item I give and bequeath to my two grand sons Sir John Clay and Edward Clay two Negro Slaves Haim and Hager and all their Increase now in their possession to be equally divided between them when Edward shall come to the age of twenty one — To them and to each of their heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son in law Francis Mosley now in his possession two negroes viz. Frank and James and their increase to him and to his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Anderson now in her possession one negro girl named Jannet and her Increase also two pounds current money to her and to her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Susan two negroes viz. David now in her possession and Hannah and her future Increase all these pounds current money to her and to her heirs forever.

Item I give to my two sons John & Edward my two daughters
Mary & Susan the my time given and the same to be divided
between my four sons and her lot and the same to be
equally divided between them.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Edward Williams my mill
and some tools and all the rest of my household furniture and
stock not before given away or disposed of that remains in my
possession to him and to his heirs forever.

I give to my son Thomas Williams what ready money he shall
be possessed of or is due to me after my last debts are all paid
and satisfied.

My will and desire is that my sons Thomas, John, and Edward
Williams do pay an equal part of the Legacies given to my daughters
and lastly I do appoint and ordain my two sons Thomas and
Edward Williams executors of this my last will and testament
reversing all former wills by me made and declaring this to be
my last will testament and desire that my estate be not
appraised in court whereof I have affixed my hand and
Seal this 2nd day of June 1765.

season giving security whereupon he together with Nathan Mayely and
Mark Taylor two securities entered into bond with condition according to
law and liberty is reserved to the other Executors to join in bond.
