

In the name of God Amen I Frederick Hatcher of the parish of Littleton in the county of Harrison being of sound mind and memory do make and record this my last will and testament in manner and form following.

First I leave unto my wife Sarah Hatcher during the time she continues my widow the full of the land and plantation whereon I now live also all my negro stocks of every kind and household furniture she thereon to raise school and maintain my children and after her marriage or death I give the same as follows.

I give unto my son John Hatcher what he has already in possession.

I give unto my daughter Susanah Hobson what she has already in possession.

I give unto my son Benjamin Hatcher and to his heirs forever one hundred acres of land lying on the south side of the road to join the lands of Josiah Thomson and David Bouton and by a line to be run from the road to my line next to Benjamin's line and also one negro boy named Bob and one sow coll.

I give unto my son Frederick Hatcher and to his heirs forever the plantation whereon I now live with remainder of the tract of land also one negro boy named Steph and one deer.

I give unto my daughter Mary Hatcher one negro girl named Ann.

I give unto my daughter Betty Hatcher one negro boy named Peter.

I give unto my daughter Sarah Hatcher one negro girl named Hannah.

I give unto my daughter Nancy Hatcher one negro boy named Sam.

I give unto my daughter Lucy Hatcher one negro boy named Joe.

I give unto my son Henry Hatcher one negro boy named Will.

If either my children above named die without issue my will is that the same

I give unto my son Henry Hatcher one negro boy named Mice.

If either my children above named die without heir my wife or that her part of such dying may be equally divided amongst my other children.
If either of my two sons Benjamin Hatcher or Frederick should die without heir I give their part of the land to my son Henry Hatcher to him his heirs forever.
I give the negroes Shocks and household furniture left my said wife and not before mentioned to my children on the other side to such of my children as my wife shall determine as she may think proper by gift in her life or by will or her will.
my son John Hatcher and my daughter Susannah Hatcher who had no children shares of my estate.

I direct there be no appraisement of my estate.

Lastly I constitute and appoint my wife Sarah Hatcher executrix and my son John Hatcher executor to this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 15th day of June 1782
