and my Body I desire may be decently interred at the
discretion of my executors For the worldly goods & Estate
wherewith I hath pleased God to bless me I dispose thus
as follows (Viz^d) I Give and bequeath to my two
Sons Edward & Langshild Harman my Part of
Land on which I formerly lived containing one hundred
acres be the same more or less to be equally divided
between them and their heirs forever

I Give & bequeath to my Daughter Tabitha Harman
all the residue of My Estate whether real or personal
of what kind soever it ^{may} be to her and her heirs forever
And lastly I do hereby certify that I am of sound mind & memory

Land on which I formerly lived containing one hundred
acres be the same more or less to be equally divided
between them and their heirs forever.

Then I give bequeath to my Daughter Tatisha Hamner
all the residue of My Estate whether real or personal
of that kind ^{may} come to her and her heirs forever.

And lastly I do appoint my two Sons Edward &
Langifield Hamner Executors of this my last Will & Testament.
In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal
this 4th day of March 1785.

possessor of Jesse Woodson I give and devise to be equally
divided between my grandson Drury Woodson the son of Drury
and my grandson William Woodson the son of Abraham
I give and devise to Drury and William one hundred
twenty five acres of Land part of a tract that I give
