twenty one years.

I give unto Walter Hebble son of Walter Hebble and to his heirs forever the land  
and plantation whereon his father Walter Hebble now lives forever by the name  
of Handwicks he to have possession when he comes to the age of twenty one years.

I give unto Walter Hebble son of Dorothy Hebble and Walter Hebble son of Walter  
Hebble and to their heirs all my negroes with all my personal estate of every  
kind to be equally divided between them when they come to the age of twenty  
one years.

Lastly I constitute and appoint Walter Hebble son? here and sole executor of  
this my last will and testament.

I give unto Walter Hebble son of Walter Hebble and to his heirs forever the land and plantation whereon his father Walter Hebble now lives known by the name of Manduiker he to have possession when he comes to the age of twenty one years.

I give unto Walter Hebble son of Dorothy Hebble and Walter Hebble son of Walter Hebble and to their heirs all my negroes with all my personal estate of ever kind to be equally divided between them when they come to the age of twenty one years.

Lastly I constitute and appoint Walter Hebble son? here and sole executor of this my last will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
