queath to my Son Isaac Duffe the plantation with one
hundred and fifty Acres of Land wheair I now live to him
and his Heirs & Assigns for ever. and if either of my Sons
Diac before they arise to the age of twenty one years the
other to have his Land and at the Death or Marriage
