and furniture and two Dishes and half a dozen of plates and one Iron pot
I will give and I will make my son Francis Harris that Tract of Land where
it looks like on a branch of Little Bear Creek to be held by him and his Heirs
forever with one Negro named Ned and four cows and calves and four Sows and
meat and corn sufficient for the 3 year and one featherbed and furniture and
Dishes and half a Dozen plates and one Iron pot. I then I believe my Wife is
Child now and if it should be a Boy I give my Land on Blewstone to be
divided between my son Francis and the said Child to be held by them and their
heirs forever but if it should be a girl then I give all that Land to my ^{son} ~~son~~ ^{son} ~~son~~
to be held by him and his heirs forever with one Negro named Will and one
bed and furniture and two Dishes and six plates and one pot and four

bequeath to my Daughter Mary one Negro named Fanny with one Bed and
furniture and two Dishes and six plates one young Horse or mare and a
side Saddle. Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Martha one
Negro named Hannah with one Bed and furniture and two Dishes and six
plates and one young Horse or mare and a side Saddle. Item I give and
bequeath unto the Child my wife with Child with.

James B. Barnes deceased in his last will and testament devised
of the said James Barnes deceased. His said will and testament being
first duly proved. Pursuant to the said will and testament the said
said James Barnes devised the said real and personal estate
by that his will and testament to the said Mary Barnes his
daughter in his perfect sense. Whereupon the same is ordered to be recorded
and on the petition of the said Mary Barnes a certificate is granted
to her for obtaining letters of administration of the estate of the said
James Barnes deceased. And she the said Mary herein
bound recognizes all benefit of advantage which she might claim
under the said will of the said James Barnes. Therefore she with
Bartholomew Howell of William Smith the Elder her securities
entered into a Acknowledges their Bond for her due administration of the
said estate.
