boy Peter, to have and his heirs forever.

Item I give to my son Thomas Bradley one negro
man Ned, old Lucy except a girl child in
increased, but if he should die before married the

said negroes to be equally divided among my
son William Bradley, son of the said

White, Mary Dunkham, house, lot, and
Brown or three negroes. Item I give to
David Bradley the manure, and
I now live likewise two negroes. I will
one still as it stands my part and my
own, but if he should die before marriage
lawfull her she land to descend to

negroes young Cole and Sam and increase to her

increase to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give to my daughter Jenny Anderson one
negro girl Fide, which she now have in possession
with her increase to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give to my daughter Nancy Brown two
negroes old Cole and Sarah with their in-
crease to her and her heirs forever.

Item My will and desire is that if any of my negroes
before mentioned, should die before my wife Phoebe
Bradleys decease, except old Cole and old Lucy,
that my other children should make up the value
in proportion one of their parts given as aforesaid.

Item My will and desire is that all my perso-
nal estate such as stock and house hold fer-
niture be equally divided after my wife Phoebe
Bradleys decease among my children William
Bradley, John Bradley, Hezekiah Bradley, Sa-
muel Bradley, David Bradley, Sarah Holland, John
Holland, Mary Southman, Jenny Anderson, &c.
