and will be paid in full when he comes of age

this to be my last will and Testament in Maine and I have for
Loving & If it is well best and Proper by executors entreated of
the direction of my executors hereafter named to make care-

ful provision which I hereby forbid and command wholly

that it shall please God to let me with a peaceful death

in Maine following offering of just debts paid and a

few legacies which I shall hereafter mention above and

legacies unto my loving wife Maria and my little both

well and pecuniary or of other value or advantage

in the Colony of Virginia to her and her heirs forever and

any other sum should be worth better at the time of my

Death than three hundred pounds English money

wife should prove with Child at home among such sum
