piece giving the Mill here upon for his erect one hundred

free acres and my Horse and Mare the Horse is Light Gray and
Mare brought Gray to him and to his heirs forever.

Then I give to my Sister Mary Sugra my Negro Woman named
Judy to her and to her heirs forever and I leave my Negro Boy
Jugary for the twenty Pound I owe him.

Then I give to my Sister Judith Tenke my Negro Girl Jane to
her and to her heirs forever.

Then I give to Sister Mauderant my household goods wearing cloth
and Beds and two young horses and calves or 13 eq with calf

live there and my horse and Mare the horse is light grey
Mare brought May to him and to his Mare forever.

I have I give to my Sister Mary Jague my Negro Mamma
guy to her and to her Mare forever and I leave my Negro Mamma
Jague for the twenty Pound I owe her.

I have I give to my Sister Judith Seake my Negro Girl for
to her Mare forever.

I have I give to Sister Pondumant my Household Goods wearing
and Bree and two young boys and calves or 13 eq with half
him and his Mare forever. among other cattle and Hogs to be sold
by my Sister.

I have I appoint John Seake & William Jague Executors of
this my last Will and Testament and do give and Deceit
if my Brother Daniel dies without issue it falls to Sister Ford
and I do hereby discharge all Wills heretofore by me made.
