It is my desire to be buried in a genteel manner, & my just debts & funeral
expences be paid out of my estate by my executors having after mine
I give & bequeath to my loving wife Ann all my estate both real & personal to
her & her heirs forever. but if she shall marry, it is my desire that my estate
be equally divided between my wife & my children Gertrude, Susanna,
Samuel & Mary to them & their heirs forever. but in case of the death of

either of them without issue lawfully begotten, the estate shall be equally divided between the survivors of them.

I give & bequeath to my son Willm Jones five shillings Sterling.

It is my desire that my younger children be educated at the discretion of my executors.

I do appoint my beloved friends Willm Jones of Bedford county, Evan Magland & John Magland his son, both of Maryland county, executors of this my last will & testament.
