to him and his heirs etc. I am I give and bequeath to Martin Dowsy son of

Richard Dondy the other parts of my land supposed to be my own or mine about
 John and his heirs forever. I am all the rest of my estate of real or personal or kind
 never accounted for I leave to hold and equally divide between all my
 brother and sisters. Lastly I nominate and appoint my loving brother Ben-
 jamin Martin whole and sole executor of this my last will and testament
 for purposes whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this third day of January
 in y^e year of our Lord 1777.
