telling the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed
for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and
testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and be-
commend my soul into the hands of God that gave it and for my
body I bequeath it to the Earth to be buried in a Christianlike and
quiet manner at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting
but that God will direct them I shall make the same known by the
writing thereof God and attending such matters as shall concern
it that I have left to my Executors and I give and bequeath of the
same in the following manner and form
I bequeath and give unto my Executors my land at
Lans

and during her natural life to her children
and to be divided between my two eldest sons, William Jones &
Joseph Jones.

I also bequeath my dearly beloved Wife my whole estate during
her life and at her death to ^{be} divided between my two

children William Jones, and Judy Tarps and Joseph Jones and
John Jones and Mary Jones and Robert Jones, and Jane Jones.

I also bequeath to my dear by beloved wife Jane Jones and
William Jones my dearly beloved son Executor of my estate
