Then I give unto my Son Richard Wheatwood one hundred acres of
Land with that plantation he now lives on. I desire that my
Wife Mary may live on the plantation during her life
without any Interruption. If so be they should disagree
I desire that my son Richard should build a house or a small
farm for her to live in.
