hamp and county of Cumberland being very sick and weak but of good
disposing sense and memory do make this my last will and testament
In witness whereof I give to my beloved wife Martha Mosby in right of her dower
three negroes Servit, Sam Dineah and Jem during her natural
life and at her death to be equally divided among all my children
then living Likewise my two cows called Dant and side saddle two cows
and calves one bed and furniture of the value of ten pounds three ewes
and lambs five hogs and one third of my land.
I have My will and desire is that my land be divided among my three

and John William and Daniel and David to have three hundred acres
where my house and plantation is and the rest to be equally divided between
John and William and Daniel and David so that my three sons should have
an equal part in the fighting place and that my negroes be equally divi-
ded among all my children when the crop is finished excepting those before
mentioned. My will and desire is that all my estate be sold except my land
and negroes to pay my debt and if any left to be equally divided among
all my children. My will and desire is that each of my daughters may
have a horse and saddle of ten pounds value when they come of age or
marries. My will and desire is that if one of my sons should die before
he comes of age that his part of the land should be equally divided between
the other two. My will and desire is that Little Benj Mosby Robert
Smith and my wife be my executors in executing of this my last will and
testament revoking all others by me made. In witness whereunto I
have set my hand and seal this 15th day of June one thousand seven
hundred and seventy two.
