I give my soul unto the arms of Jesus Christ my redeemer and my body to the earth

the house of the said deceased and the same I have fully and completely
settled and settled. And for the same I have given and bequeathed unto my
four following.

I have unto my well beloved wife Tabitha during her life the one half of that
part of the land I own live on that between the river & the highway with seven fine
negroes slaves viz. old Toney, old Sue, Phil, Sam, & Warner, and after her de-
cease I give the said negroes and their increase to be equally divided between
my three sons John, Charles & Richard & their heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Beth, Herrett two negroes slaves viz.
Molly & her increase from this date, & little Sue which she is now possessed with to
her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary three negroes viz. Hagar, Philis,
& Blenese & their future increase, also one feather bed, furniture, one worn and
side saddle & furniture to her and her heirs forever, to be paid her when she
shall arrive to the age of eighteen or married.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Anne two negroes viz. Jacob & Amy,
and their increase, also one feather bed, furniture, one worn and side saddle
and furniture to her and her heirs forever, to be paid her when she shall arrive to the
age of eighteen or married.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Polly two negroes viz. Tom & Nell &
their increase, also one feather bed, furniture, one worn and side saddle and

age of eighteen or married.
Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Betty two negroes viz. Tom & Nell &
their increase also one feather bed & furniture, one women's side saddle, and
furniture to her & her heirs forever to be paid her when she arrives to the age
of eighteen years or married.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Susanna two negroes viz. Joe &
belle & their increase also one feather bed & furniture one women's side saddle
and furniture to her & her heirs forever to be paid to her when she shall arrive
to the age of eighteen years or married.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Judah two negroes viz. Phibing
& Nanny & their increase, also one feather bed & furniture, one women's side saddle
and furniture, to her and her heirs forever to be paid her when she shall
arrive to the age of eighteen years or married.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son John all that part of my land situate
known as Lick, lying between the river & fighting creek also five negro slaves
viz. Peter, Abner, Tye, & Topsy & Jack & their increase, also my clock, and
set of pendulum, one feather bed & furniture & my leather chair to him
and to his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Charles all that part of my tract of land
that lies in the fork of fighting creek, and all that fine tract of land I pur-
chased of William Humphreys situate near the Chickasaw river and my contri-
bution two hundred acres more or less, five negro slaves viz. Sarah, Ann,

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Susanna two negroes viz: Joe & Kate & their increase also one feather bed & furniture one roomers side saddle and furniture to pass her heirs forever to be paid her when she shall come to the age of eighteen years or married.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Judith two negroes viz: Robin & Nina & their increase, also one feather bed & furniture, one roomers side saddle and furniture, to her and her heirs forever to be paid her when she shall arrive to the age of eighteen years or married.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son John all that part of my land whereon Anne lives, lying between the river & fighting creek also four negro slaves viz: Peter, Abram, Liza, & Fanny & Jack, & their increase, also my stock, some sett of pish & fowls, one feather bed & furniture & six better chairs to him and to his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Charles all that part of my tract of land that lies in the fork of fighting creek, and all that first tract of land I purchased of William Pittsford & others being children of my old wife containing two hundred acres more or less, five negro slaves viz: Pamel, Sam, Charles, Doll, and Hannah & their increase, one feather bed & furniture & six better chairs to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Richard all the black & white & grey
slaves I have and bequeath unto my son Richard all the black & white & grey
my late wife gave me & her four children, Ben, John, Charles & Bessie & their future
issue, her late husband's furniture to him & his heirs forever.

My will and desire is that my wife should keep all the rest of my personal estate
that I have not already given away during her widowhood, and after marriage or
death which should so happen first, all my stock of horses cattle and sheep with
all the rest of my personal estate that I have not already given away be equally
divided between my wife (if living) & my three sons, John, Charles & Richard
& their heirs forever.

My will & desire is that if either of my daughters should die before marriage
that then their part of my estate that I have given them shall be equally divided
between the survivors of my single daughters and their heirs forever.

My will and desire is that my wife's negroes & my sons' negroes shall be kept together
by the direction of my ex^r till all my just debts are paid. My will & desire is that
if either of my sons should die before they come of age (except they marry) that
then their part of estate that I have given them shall be equally divided between
the survivors of my other sons & their heirs forever.

My will and desire is that my estate shall not be appraised.

As for my daughter Rachel Blay & Sarah Hobson I have given them all the estate
that I intended for them, & desire they may not come in hereafter for any part of my

estate.

And lastly I do hereby declare this to be my last will & testament revoking all former wills by me made, & declaring this to be my last will & testament and I do hereby appoint and ordain my friend Thomas Profer and my son in law Samuel Hobson & Arthur Mosley just ex^r of this my last will & testament In witness whereof I have affixed my hand & seal this sixth day of January one thousand seven hundred & seventy one.
