

In the name of God, Amen, I Richard Jones of Lancaster county, being
weak & low in body, but of a perfectly sound mind & memory, do make this my
last will & testament.

Item, I leave unto my dear wife Mary, with the tract of land whereon I now
live with all the appurtenances thereto belonging, I also leave unto my
beloved wife Mary, all the negroes (viz) Tomah, Hope, Silvery, Lucy, Deftney,
Jury & Lucy during her natural life or widowhood, I also leave unto my beloved
wife my part of the negroes arising from my former estate during her natural
life or widowhood. Item, I also leave unto my beloved wife all my household
& kitchen furniture together with all stock of horses, neat cattle, sheep &c.
during her natural life or widowhood, Item, I also leave unto my wife my
wife all the money on hand, & arrears that which is due by bond or otherwise.
Item, I give & bequeath unto my two children (viz) Polly & William, two
estates both real & personal before mentioned, to be equally divided between them at
death or marriage of my wife, but if she should dye before they come of age, then
the estate to be taken into the care of the ex^{rs} & trusted & to be put to the best advantage
for the children, and if either of them dye without heir lawfully begotten
in their body, then their part shall fall to the survivor. My father will & desire
is that my land on Stanton river in Halifax county containing two hundred & fifty
acres be sold at the discretion of the ex^{rs} the ensuing spring or as soon as
may be offered agreeable to the value of it, & the money laid out in the purchase
negro or negroes; & lent to my wife as above.

My father will & desire is that if my wife should dye before the children

My farther will & desire is that if my wife should die before the children
of age that the stock of every kind, crop, carpenters & plantation tools, with
household & kitchen furniture of all kinds, (except two feather beds & furniture
proper of all kinds) be sold & the money laid out in the purchase of a
negroes for the use of the children; also what species of property
off of the place I have may be sold at the same time & the money
paid to the use as above; And lastly I do constitute & appoint James Dejeu
Joseph Dejeu, Joseph Michaux, Sayer Scott, William Green, my
and my wife Mary Price executors of this my last will and testament, and do
revoke & revoke all other will or wills heretofore made by me, and I hereby
heretofore set my hand and seal this twenty third day of March 1766
hundred & eight years.
