the motion of Martha Walton executrix and Thomas Walton
Executor therein named who made oath according to law ex-
ecute is granted them for obtaining ^{proof} thereof in due form giving
security whereupon they together with Joseph Lannington,
George Cox and Henry Cox their securities entered into and
acknowledged bond with caution according to law

In the Name of God Amen. I Samuel Bridgewater
of the County of Cumberland, being in a low state of health but of
perfect mind and memory do make this my last Will and Testa-
ment in manner and form following, first I recommend my soul
to God who gave it & my body to be buried in a decent Chur-

Item I like ~~myself~~ to do to what good I like. I leave the Al.
to my son ~~Thomas~~ on my ~~will~~ of a full mind.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Thomas ten shillings and
six pence to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son William two shillings and
six pence to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son John two shillings and
six pence to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Samuel ten pounds current
to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Rebecca two shil-
lings and six pence to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my ^{son} Richard all my land on the
south side of the creek to him and his heirs forever.

Item it is my desire that John Jefferson do buy my land on
the north side of Little Grooms Quarter Creek, at the rate of
fifteen shillings of an acre, & that my Executors or his giving
that sum, make him a right to the same, to him and his
heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Richard — The land
on the north side of the creek.

on the north side of the Creek, Provided John Jefferson do
not chuse to purchase, ⁱⁿ the above piece to him and his
heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Half my
personal estate after my Just debts be paid to her and her
heirs for ever.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Ann the other half
my personal. after paying my Just debts to her and her
heirs for ever

Item it is my desire that the money arising from my land
mentioned for John Jefferson do be apply'd towards paying
my Just debts.

Item I appoint my friends Alexander Dent & John Jefferson
my Executors, Sign'd, Seald, and acknowledged this 1st day of
March one thousand seven hundred and seventy two

motion of the undersigned one of the executors therein named who
appeared before the court to law certificate is granted him for obtaining
a writ of habeas corpus in due form giving security, whereupon he with
James Gentry Daniel Bates and Thomas Montague his securities
entered into and acknowledged bond with condition according to
law. And liberty is reserved to the other executor to join in petition
for Thompson's return etc.

In obedience to an Order of Cumberland County bearing date 25th
Nov. 1771 We the undersigned being Just Sworn have affirmed the
