tioned.

To my well beloved wife Ann often I give the use benefit and profit of two hun-
dred and ninety seven acres of land with my manour plantation and all stocks
of all kinds excepting two free horses and furniture and two cows and calves
and all the remainder part of my household hold goods and working tools & other
things therein or to the same property belonging except what shall hereafter be
otherwise particularly devised and given I direct and will to be by my ^d wife
held and quietly used and enjoyed during her natural life widowhood and to my
^d wife Ann I bequeath the use benefit and advantage of the labour of my whole
number of negro slaves except as before during her life or widowhood and after
her decease or at the day of her marriage then my said land and negroes & all
estate of any kind hereby lent to her use to be by her forfeited and lost and directly to
become the property and be in the possession of them to whom hereafter given in
the same manner as if my ^d widow was really dead.

Now I give and bequeath to my son Samuall Oflin the said tract of land containing of two hundred & ninety seven acres which I now live on to him and his heirs forever

Now I give to my daughter Elizabeth, Annsted one negro named Heaven to her and her heirs lawfully begotten of her body and if the s^d Elizabeth Annsted shall die without heirs of her body lawfully begotten then the said negro Heaven to revert and return to my son Jesse Oflin to him and his heirs forever.

Now I give and bequeath to my daughter Tabitha Oflin one negro named Torr and one feather bed and furniture and one cow and calf to her and her heirs forever lawfully begotten of her body but if the s^d Tabitha Oflin shall die without heirs of her body lawfully begotten then the said Torr to revert to my son George Oflin to him and his heirs forever.

As my beloved wife is now big with child

Now I give and bequeath if a daughter one feather bed and furniture and one cow and calf and a equal part with my sons namely Jesse Oflin Martin Oflin & James Oflin & George Oflin to her and her heirs forever and if a son to have & equal part with my four sons above mentioned to him & his heirs forever.

To revert and return to my sons Jesse Martin & James & George Oflins so that that my beloved wife is now big with if a son namely to be equally divided with Harry Sue & Thel & my self and household goods and other estate lent my wife as aforesaid and all my other estate both real and personal that is not herein before

and I give to my daughter Elizabeth arrested one negro named Heaven to her and her heirs lawfully begotten of her body and if the s^d Elizabeth arrested shall die without heirs of her body lawfully begotten then the said negro Heaven to revert and return to my son Jesse O'Flynn to him and his heirs forever.

Now I give and bequeath to my daughter Sabithy O'Flynn one negro named Tarr and one feather bed and furniture and one cow and calf to her and her heirs forever lawfully begotten of her body but if the s^d Sabithy O'Flynn shall die without heirs of her body lawfully begotten then the said Tarr to return to my son George O'Flynn to him and his heirs forever.

As my beloved wife is now big with child

I now to give and bequeath if a daughter one feather bed and furniture and one cow and calf and a equal part with my sons namely Jesse O'Flynn Martin O'Flynn & James O'Flynn & George O'Flynn to her and her heirs forever and if a son to have & equal part with my four sons above mentioned to him & his heirs forever.

To revert and return to my sons Jesse Martin & James & George O'Flynn so that that my beloved wife is now big with if a son namely to be equally divided with Henry Sue & Hans & my still and household goods and other estate lent my wife as aforesaid and all my other estate both real and personal that is not herein before given I give and bequeath to be equally divided between my

and I do nominate and appoint
my beloved wife Ann O'Flynn and James Mops to executors of this my last will and
testament and I do declare this to be my last will and testament revoking all
others by me made and for establishing this to be my last will I have hereunto
affixed my seal and set my hand this 28 May 1769.

This last will and testament of Samuel O'Flynn deceased was proved by Denny
Hudgens and James Hudgens witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded and on
the petition of Ann O'Flynn executrix therein named who made oath according to
law certificate is granted her for obtaining a probat thereof in due form giving
security Whereas she together with James Mops and Peter McKinnon Shove
junior her securities entered into bond according to law and liberty is returned
to the executor therein named to join in probat.
