Item I give and bequeath to Wife Charity Woodson to be

for ever all the rest of my Estate that will come to me

Therefore I constitute and appoint my loving Wife Charity

my Executrix. In Witness whereof I have hereunto

Hand and Seal the thirteenth Day of November 1784

at my Dwelling
