that he pay forty pounds toward money into my estate to be
disposed of as hereafter directed

Item, I give and bequeath to my said son Bernard ten pounds out of
my estate

Item, I give and bequeath unto my ^{beloved} son William Coleman Tully

Impressio. I will that ^{all} my just debts and funeral charges be duly paid.
Item. My will and desire is that my beloved son Bernard Guttery have
my Negro fellow ^{named} Joe to him and his heirs forever on condition
that he pay forty pounds current money into my estate to be
disposed of as hereafter directed.

Item. I give and bequeath to my said son Bernard ten pounds out of
my estate.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my ^{beloved} son William Coleman Guttery
thirteen pounds current money to be paid out of my estate.

Item. I give and bequeath to my said son William Coleman one
feather bed and furniture.

Item. I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Patty Guttery twelve
pounds current money to be paid ^{by} my executors out of my estate,
also one feather ^{bed} and furniture, and one riding horse and side saddle
to be provided for her out of my estate by my executors.

Item. I give and bequeath to my beloved grandson Henry Guttery son of my
beloved son Bernard, six pounds current money to be paid by my
executors out of my estate.

Item. I give and bequeath to my beloved grand daughter Lucy Eliza

to be paid to my daughter Ellen at the time of her marriage

the sum of five hundred pounds and I will be bound out by my executors yearly for as much as her father's money shall be used by her of that money to be paid yearly by my executors to my daughter Elizabeth for her own proper use and behoof and to the person who shall be appointed

Item I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Ann Coleman one shilling sterling to be paid out of my estate by my executors

Item I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Mary Coleman one shilling sterling to be paid out of my estate

My will and desire is that after the death of me and my wife all the rest and residue of my estate and credits be equally divided between and among my two sons Robert and William Coleman and my daughter Cally by an equal division and in case either of them die without issue then her the said

division be between the survivors and their issue if any lawfully begotten.

Lastly, I do nominate and appoint my true and lawful executor, of this
my last will and testament and it is my will and desire
that my two sons and executors do distribute my estate as is
before directed, with any administration or appointment
thereon hereby revoking and disannulling all former wills
by me heretofore made and declaring this to be my only
true will and testament In witness whereof I have here-
unto set my hand and seal this 20th day of September
one thousand seven hundred and seventy one
