In the name of God I Thomas Hill of the county of Cumberland, being perfect health of body and soundness of memory hereby be given unto you calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed all men once to die do make and declare this my last will and testament. First I give and recommend my soul unto the hand of Almighty God who hath made it, and my body to the earth to be buried decently at the discretion of my friends, best not touching such worldly estate to which I am entitled under the last will and testament of my father Joseph Hill dec^d. I give and dispose of the same in the following manner.

Item I give and bequeath unto my brother William Hill all money I have in possession with all I am entitled to under the last will of my dec^d father, to be appropriated to his most profitable uses for him, until his marriage or arrives to the age of twenty one years at which time my desire is that he may actually enjoy and be put in full possession thereof.

Item I give and bequeath unto my brother Joseph Hill my house and lands to be sold to the best advantage and the money thence arising to be appropriated to the most profitable uses as the exigencies of his affairs may require, until his

arrived to the age of twentyone years or more, at which time my desire is that he may act
freely and enjoy the same.

I appoint my father in law Daniel Allen my executor of this my last will and testament
and do hereby revoke disavow and make void all other wills heretofore made by me either
verbal or written and do acknowledge this to be my last will and testament. In witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this twenty seventh day of March one thousand
seven hundred and seventy nine.
