three make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament
in manner and form following Viz^d

Item I give to my Daughter Francis Netherland all the Negroes
and their increase left by my Father and now in possession of
my Sister Francis Macon wife of Henry Macon to her
and heirs forever but in case my afores^d Daughter should
die without lawful issue then the aforesaid Negroes to
be equally divided between five children of my Sister
Mary the wife of Suckan Woodson Viz^d Wille Woodson
John Woodson Benjamin Woodson Henry Woodson
Sarah Woodson and there heirs for ever.

Item I give to my Daughter Francis Netherland the following
Negroes (Viz^d) John, Pops, Joe Susan Maguel, Jack
Samuel, Effa, Robin, Ellick, Billee, Beck, Ann, Chester
Sam, Sam, all my lands to her and her heirs for ever
but in case my aforesaid daughter should die without

My lawful issue then my Will is that the said
Negro and Land should be equally divided between
the five children afore mention of my Sister Mary
the wife of Tucker Woodson, ^{and} there heirs for ever.

Item I give to my loving wife Ann Netherland the follow-
ing Negro Sam Beck, late, Lyda, Peter, Tom, Lucy,
Rob. now in Cumberland County and Longston and
Pamot, with all my movable Estate to her and her heirs
for ever. I do also appoint my loving Wife Ann Nether-
land with Henry Macon & Jacob Michaux my whole
and sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament
